How to Apply to Spartanburg Family Medicine Residency Program, Spartanburg, SC

- We accept applications <u>only</u> through ERAS. Please do not submit applications through e-mail or fax as those applications will be discarded.
- We do make a practice of accepting trainees who require VISA sponsorship.
- Twelve (12) PGY-1 positions are available:
 - Positions are through the NRMP Match (Program # 10981523)
- The deadline to submit your application through ERAS is December 30th. You are welcome to apply after the deadline, but depending on the number
 of applications received, we cannot guarantee that your application will be reviewed in time to set up an interview.
- Our program will be interviewing from October through February. We will not be interviewing the weeks of the following holidays: Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year.

A completed ERAS application for our residency consists of:

- Completed Common ERAS Application Form
- Curriculum Vitae
- Three (3) Letters of Recommendation written within the past year by U.S. Physicians you have worked with clinically. Letters must be written on the physician's letterhead stationery. Letters written on plain paper will not be accepted.
- Personal Statement explaining why you want to go into family medicine.
- Head Photo (passport type) picture taken within the past six months.
- Medical School Transcript There is a cutoff date of 2 years since medical school graduation, and you must have been actively involved in clinical medicine during the past two years.
- Board Scores The minimum score requirement for USMLE Step 1- PASS, Step 2- 209; COMLEX Part 1 PASS, Part 2- 440. USMLE Step 2 and COMLEX Part 2 passing scores are required for ranking.
- Dean's Letter
- ECFMG Certificate, if applicable

Minimum Requirements for Consideration:

Two months minimum of Clinical Rotations in the United States within the last 2 years precepted by a licensed allopathic or osteopathic physician.

Clinical Rotations must include independent and direct:

Contact with patients

History taking

Physical examinations

Development of differential diagnoses

Identification of relevant clinical findings

Problem assessments

Formulation of management plans

Observerships or Externships which do not include the above will not be accepted. Observerships/Externships must be hands on experience.

The program looks at your application as a whole. It is not accepted or declined just by your board scores.

Additional Requirements for Appointment and Employment at Spartanburg Regional Medical Center:

- Immunizations: (records are not part of application, but is required if Matched with program by the end of April)
 - Measles, Mumps, & Rubella:
 - If you were born before 1957: Proof of immunization to Rubella by vaccination or Titer
 - If you were born on or after 1957: Proof of immunity to Rubella, Rubeola, and Mumps
 - Hepatitis B Vaccine:
 - Series Completed and Dated or Series in Progress with list of pending dates to be completed
 - Documented declination of vaccine
 - Varicella (Chicken Pox): Validate Varicella Titer or 2 Vaccines
 - o Tuberculosis: Documented negative result on screening exam within the current year.
- Criminal background check: All potential employees are subject to a criminal background check and cannot be employed unless this is satisfactory.
- Drug Screen: All potential employees are subject to a drug screening check and cannot be employed unless this is satisfactory.

Orientation Classes: Interns must attend Orientation Classes in June, unless they can present documentation of current certification for ACLS (Advanced Cardiac Life Support), PALS (Pediatric Advanced Life Support), BLS (Basic Life Support), and ALSO (Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics). The dates have not been finalized yet but should start around the middle to the end of June.

All interns must be ready to start employment by mid-June. Applicants who match with our program but are not able to begin employment by mid-June are subject to immediate dismissal.
